Two important things worth reposting from December: Bargaining Starts in January

As you probably know, our current contract expires at the end of June 2024. Our Combined Negotiations Committee has been preparing to begin that process, which officially begins in

January. We look forward to talking to the district about our goals for the next contract. It's important for you, as members of the LMEA, to understand that negotiations are not a public matter–by and large, you will not receive regular updates, nor any reports with detailed information in them. This is another way of saying if you see something on Facebook, it's probably not real.

Snow Days

It's December, which in some years means we should be prepared for snowy, icy, windy weather. It's been awhile since we had a rough winter, but just in case there is a plan forming for how to adjust if we start missing days. The first two days will be traditional, old-fashioned snow days: no school, no zoom, no coming to work. In that instance, the contract calls for staff to make up one of those days, but our hope is that makeup can be accomplished without adding a day to the district calendar (fingers crossed).

After the second snow day, school days impacted by severe weather will take place virtually. Principals are now in the process of designing and refining what that looks like for teachers and students, and we're working with administration on ways to communicate with parents once that plan is finalized.
